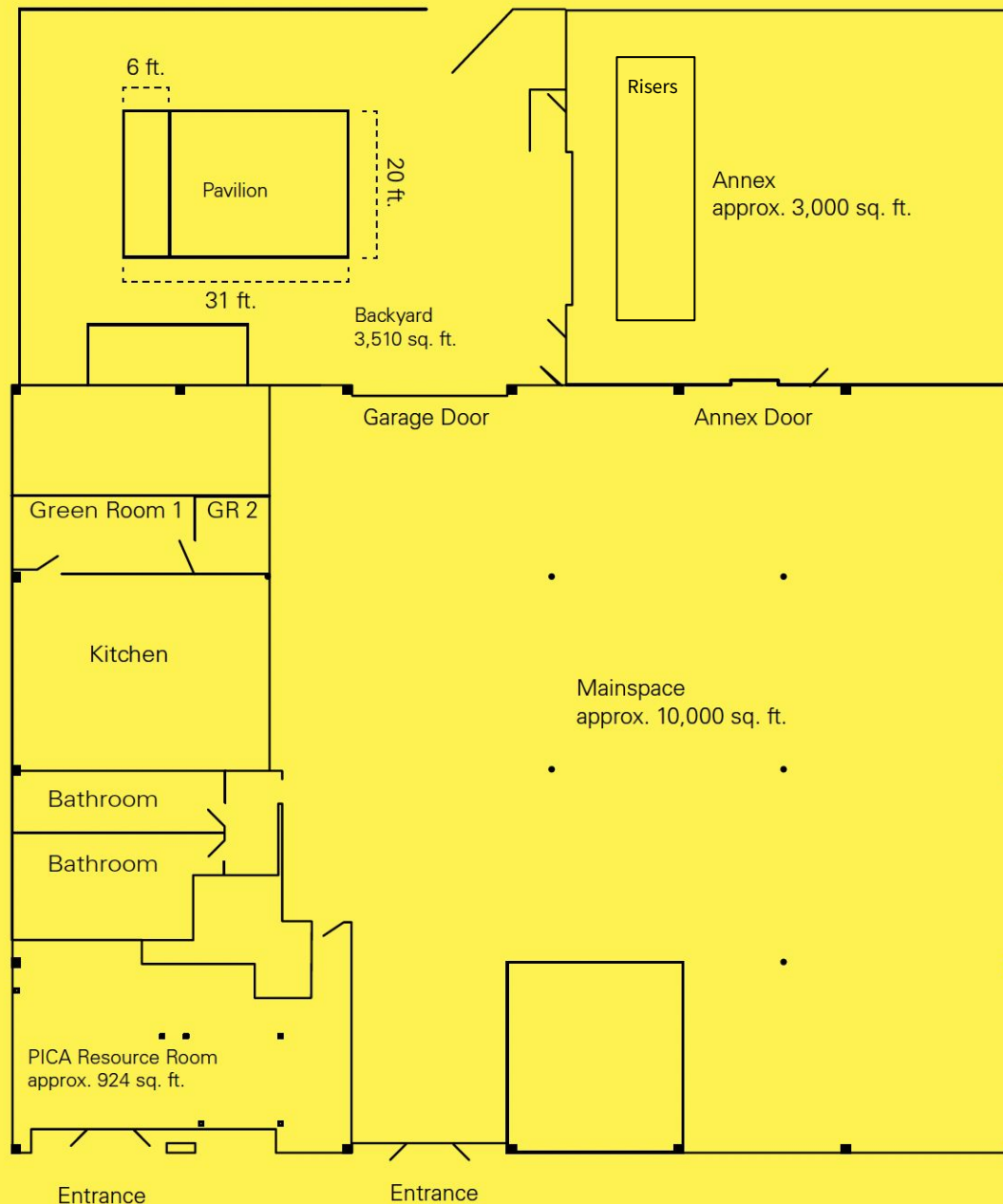




Located in Northeast Portland's Eliot neighborhood PICA's impressive **16,000 square feet of space** serves as a home for artists, neighbors, community members, arts workers, and out-of-towners alike!

Our **ADA-accessible building** offers a variety of spaces to suit your needs, and all of the proceeds from your rentals directly supports PICA's nonprofit mission to champion the artists of our time. Spaces include:

- **PICA's Main Space** is the ultimate blank canvas with two large roll-up garage doors, large event capacity, and an LED lighting system build into the ceiling
- **PICA's Annex** is a black-box theater space that can be used for photoshoots, screenings, parties, and more!
- Our window-lined **Resource Room** that is perfect for meetings, a third space for working, and ideal for hosting intimate gatherings
- **PICA's Pavilion** is an all-year covered outdoor space that can be used for dinners, gatherings, outdoor talks, and more.
- **PICA's Kitchen**, arguably the heart of PICA, with multiple refrigerators, mood lighting, curtains for privacy and seating capacity for large groups.

LOCATION

ACCESSIBLE. CENTRAL. EASY TO REACH—ON FOOT, BIKE, BUS, MAX, OR STREETCAR.

PICA is centrally located in Portland, just off of highways 84 and I5 North/South Moda Center exits, one block north of the intersection of NE Broadway and N. Williams Ave.

We always encourage rideshare, biking, and public transportation. For those who don't mind the distance, the Rose Quarter Transit Center max station is a half-mile away. The 4 and 44 bus routes will drop guests just 1.5 blocks away, there is also a stop for the 17 which is about three blocks away. We encourage visitors to use Trimet or google maps to navigate the best route from their location.



ACCESS

PICA is committed to being a welcoming space for all bodies, including Deaf, Disabled, BIPOC+, and LGBTQIA2S+ communities. We strive to be an accessible venue for a wide range of needs and requirements. Below are some of the ways in which we are endeavoring to make PICA accessible:

- ASL interpretation of select performances, conversations, workshops, and events
- Priority seating for those with access needs
- Earplugs available for all performances
- ADA Wheelchair accessible bathrooms and facilities
- Bartop menus
- On-site staff prepared to answer questions about access needs

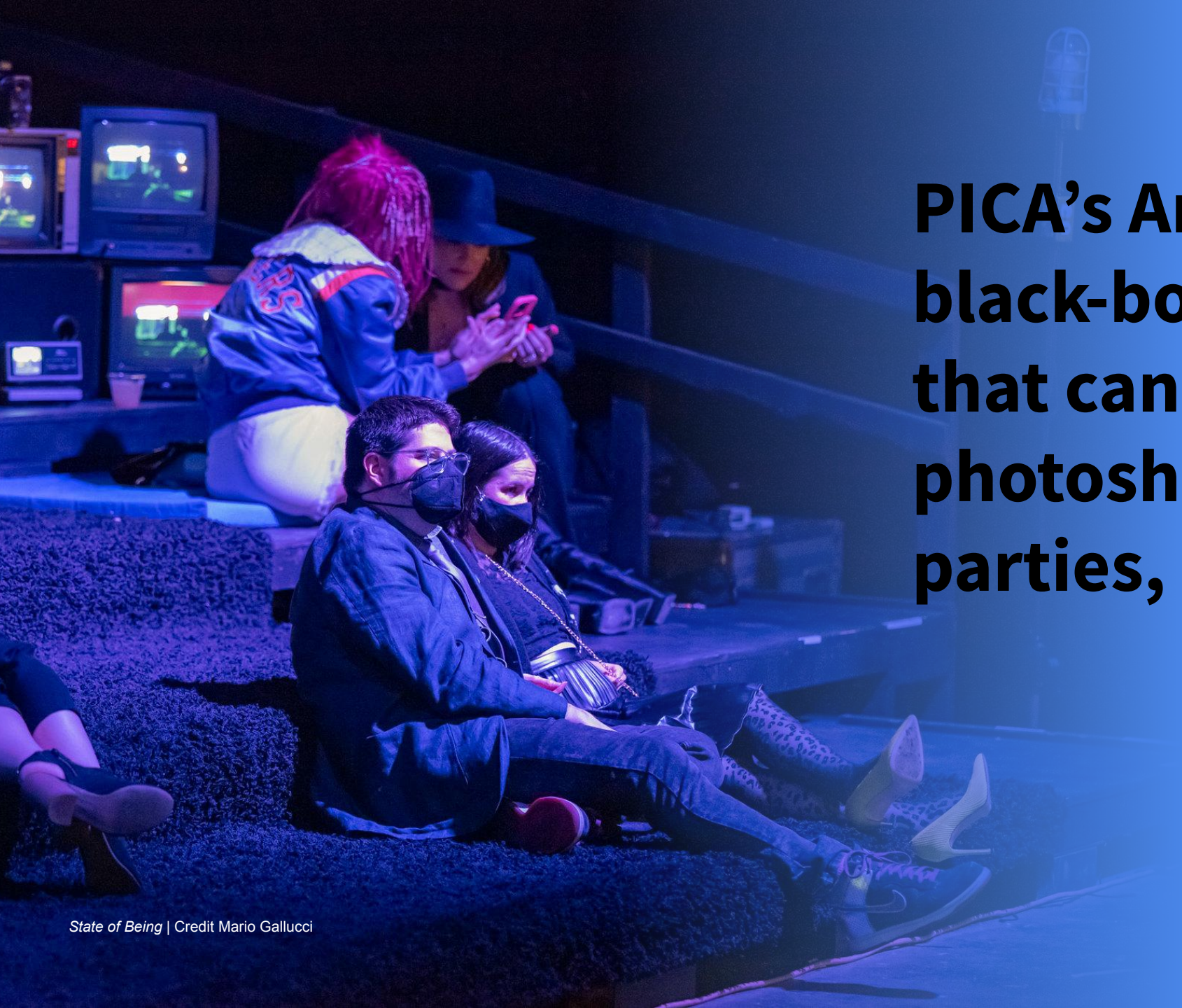

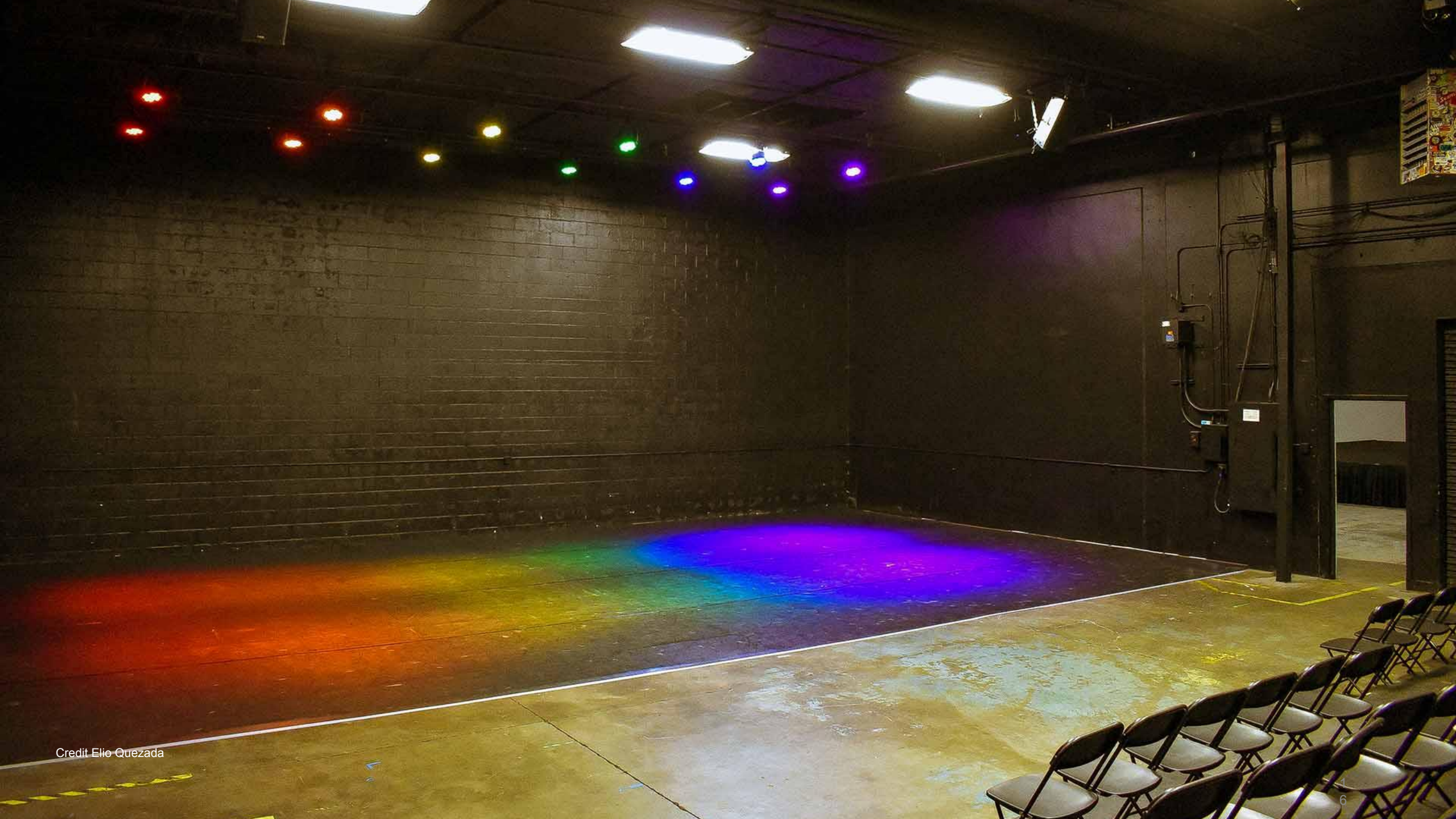

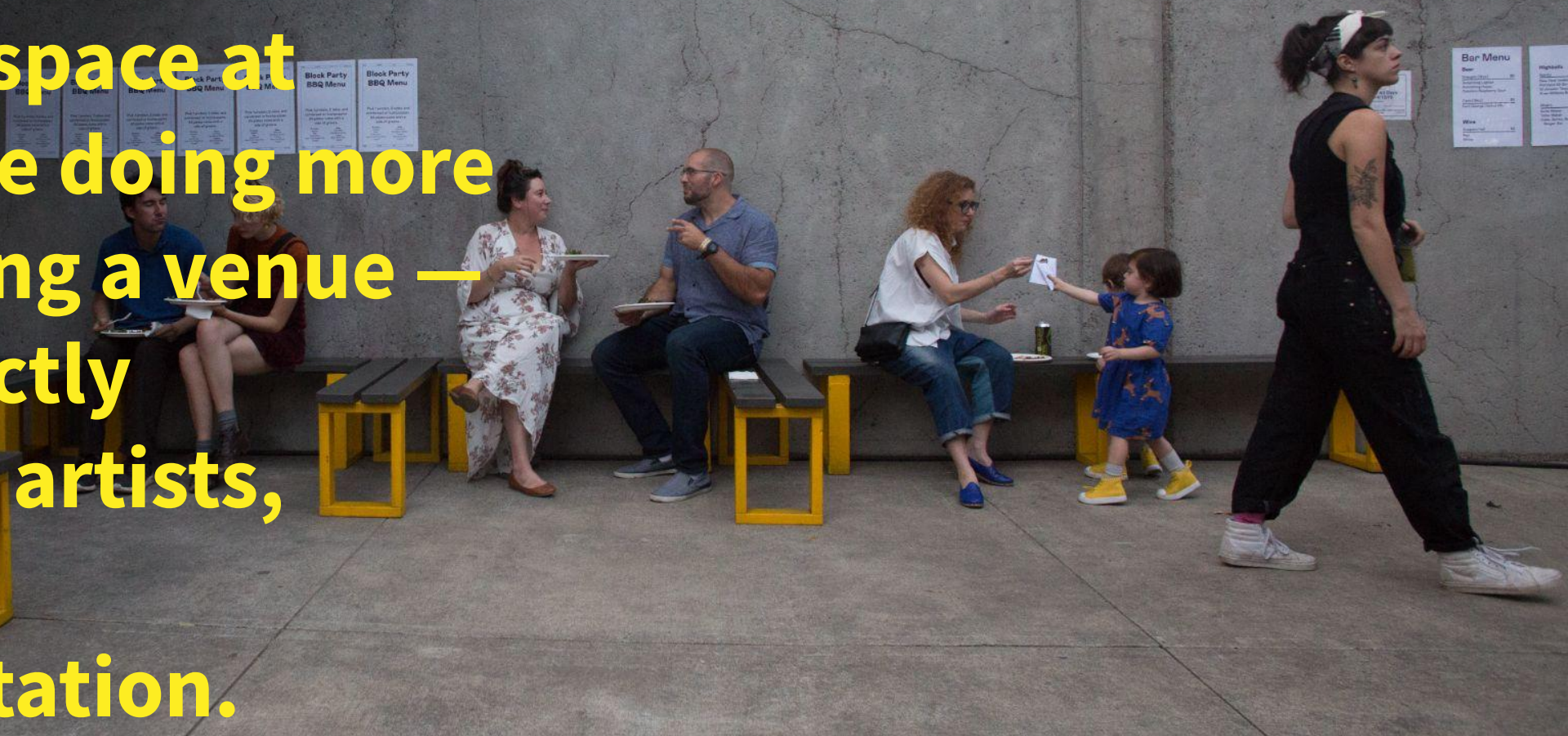
